

Guidance

DID YOU KNOW?

- Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read.
- > Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few weeks.
- Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- > Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up

WHAT YOU CAN DO

- > Don't let your child stay home unless he/she is truly sick. Keep in mind complaints of a stomach ache or headache can be a sign of anxiety and not a reason to stay home.
- > If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors, or other parents for advice on how to make him/her feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- > Develop back-up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbor, or another parent.
- Avoid medical appointments and extended trips when school is in session

Cold Weather Has Arrived!

As we enter the season for colder weather, please take note of the dress code regulations when preparing your child for the cold. Students are expected to wear Daniel Jenkins cold weather attire, unless the temperature drops to 42 degrees or below. At such time, students are permitted to wear their personal warm weather gear. Campus Safety

In order to keep our students as safe as possible, it is important that everyone on campus abide by the following guidelines:

- There isn't supervision available for students before 8:30. Therefore, please ensure that students are not dropped off prior to that time.
- Once students arrive, they are to remain on campus until dismissal. Students, who leave campus for any reason, without being checked out, will receive the appropriate consequences.
- Parents who drop students off after the tardy bell (9:00 a.m.) need to come into the office and sign their child into class; otherwise the tardy will remain unexcused.
- Guests are not allowed behind the front counter of the office, unless properly checked in by a member of the front office staff.
- To ensure all students are able to get home in a timely manner, the latest time students are allowed to be checked out of class is 3:30 p.m.
